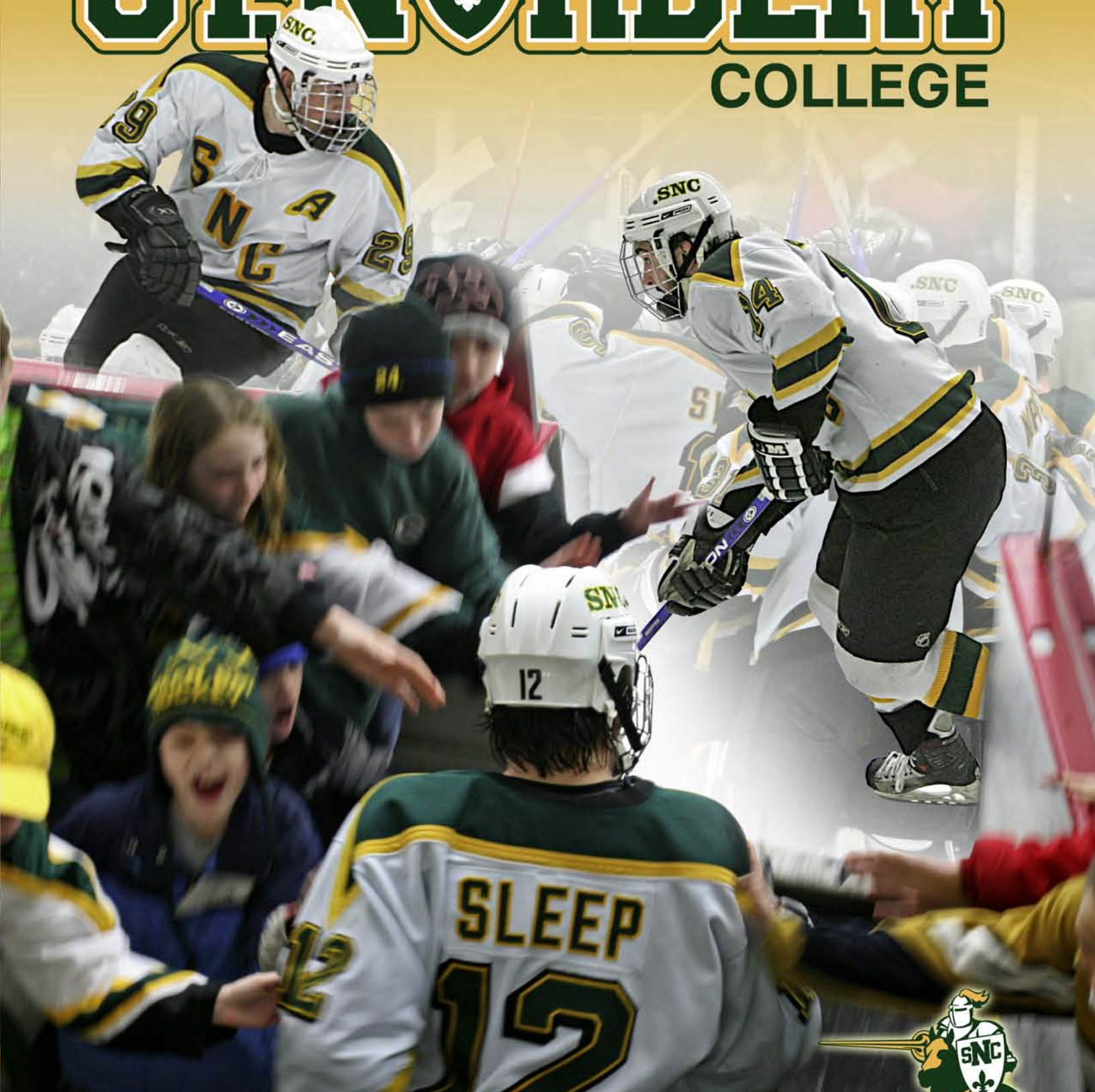

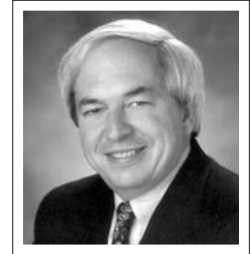

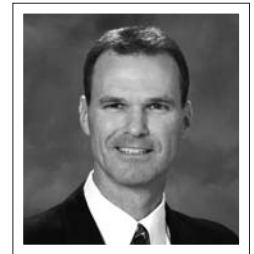

Athletics Facilities

Schuldes Sports Center: Home of the Green Knights basketball and volleyball teams with a seating capacity of 2,000. Also features racquetball courts, training room, a newly remodeled weight room and a refurbished basketball floor.

Minahan Stadium: Home of the St. Norbert football and soccer teams. Lighted football field includes 3,100 seating capacity and our international-size soccer field features scoreboard and dugouts.

Mel Nicks Sports Complex: Home of the Green Knights baseball and softball teams where the baseball team ranked second in Division III in home attendance in 1997 and 2000.

Cornerstone Community Ice Center: The state-of-the-art facility is home to the St. Norbert hockey team. The rink opened in March 2000 and features seating for nearly 2,000 fans.

Green Knights Achieve Academic and Athletic Success

In addition to the success of our teams, many of our individual athletes have earned distinction on and off the field. Not only has St. Norbert had national champions and all-conference performers, but several Academic All-Americans and Academic All-Conference selections as well.

Academic Success

- St. Norbert had 103 athletes earn Academic All-Conference honors in 2007.
- 32 athletes have earned Academic All-American accolades, the most by a Midwest Conference school.
- 50 athletes have been Academic All-District selections.

Athletic Success

- St. Norbert enjoyed its best overall season during the 2006-07 school year. The Green Knights compiled a 180-90-5 overall record, including a strong 92-26-1 mark in conference action.
- During 2006-07, 17 of St. Norbert's 20 athletic teams placed in the top half of the conference.
- The St. Norbert College hockey team finished the 2006-07 season ranked No. 1 in NCAA Division III; and was the national runner-up in 2004 and 2006, the highest finish ever by a team sport at St. Norbert.
- Since 2001, St. Norbert has claimed three individual NCAA Division III national champions in track and field.
- St. Norbert has won 64 Midwest Conference championships since joining the league in 1983.
- St. Norbert has won nine Northern Collegiate Hockey Association titles and six NCHA Peters Cup championships since joining the league in 1994.

EXCELLENT VALUE—EXCEPTIONAL REPUTATION

HEAD COACH TIM COGLIN



Under Tim Coghlin's supervision, one would be hard-pressed to find a coach who has constructed and maintained a program as successful as St. Norbert College hockey.

Bringing the Green Knights from their infancy on ice to the forefront of NCAA Division III hockey, Coghlin has compiled a 295-91-31 record in 14 seasons. During that time, St. Norbert has put together a 146-44-18 mark in the strong Northern Collegiate Hockey Association, the best tenure in league history in terms of winning percentage.

St. Norbert has appeared in nine NCAA Division III Tournaments since 1997, highlighted by its Frozen Four appearances in 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2007 – placing as national runner-up in 2004 and 2006.

Over the past 11 seasons, St. Norbert has registered an outstanding 264-55-23 ledger which includes nine NCHA regular-season championships and six NCHA Peters Cup Playoff titles. Coghlin's team have been especially tough to beat at home since moving into the Cornerstone Community Center in 2000, going a robust 101-10-5 on home ice during the seven years the Green Knights have occupied the building.

Named St. Norbert's third varsity head coach on May 26, 1993, Coghlin immediately went to work into laying the foundation for future success.

Following a 10-9-1 rookie campaign, St. Norbert entered its first season in the NCHA. The Green Knights finished sixth in the league in 1994-95 and nearly topped UW-Stevens Point in the first round of the league playoffs.

It would be the last and only time St. Norbert has finished out of the top half of the NCHA standings. The Green Knights improved to fourth with a 10-8-2 mark in 1995-96, and broke through to win the league title in 1996-97.

St. Norbert fashioned a 27-6 record in 1997-98 while winning a second consecutive NCHA championship. The Green Knights had five one-goal losses that season and the other game by just two goals. St. Norbert finished the hat trick in 1998-99, again winning the NCHA regular-season and playoff titles.

The Green Knights finished second in the NCHA in 1999-2000 but still managed 22 wins and a 19-game unbeaten streak, and then placed third in 2000-01. St. Norbert answered those seasons with its fourth and fifth NCHA championships the next two years.

In 2001-02 and 2004-05, Coghlin led St. Norbert to a 12-0-2 regular-season record in the NCHA, becoming the first coach in league history to lead a team to an unbeaten season two different times.

St. Norbert ended the 2004-05 season ranked No. 1 for the third consecutive year. The Green Knights also ended the 2003-04 regular season ranked No. 1 and made their first NCAA Division III championship game appearance, losing 1-0 in overtime to Middlebury. During the 2002-03 season, St. Norbert was ranked No. 1 for 10 weeks, including eight straight weeks in late January to mid-March.

Coghlin was named NCHA Coach of the Year in 1998, 2002, 2005 and 2006. He also received the Lee Rimmel Award for Outstanding Achievement in April 2005.

No stranger to success as a player, he captained UW-Stevens Point's first NCAA Division III championship team in 1989 and was an assistant coach with the Pointers when they won the national title in 1993 and finished runner-up in 1992.

Coghlin was a two-time All-America selection as a defenseman and three-time All-NCHA selection at Stevens Point, where he was inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame and ranks among the Pointers' all-time scoring leaders.

Following his collegiate career, Coghlin signed with the Vancouver Canucks and played briefly with the Milwaukee Admirals in 1989. He injured his shoulder in training camp the next season and joined the Fife Flyers of the British Premier League as a player and assistant coach.

A native of Summerland, British Columbia, Coghlin holds a master's degree in education and a bachelor's degree in communications, both from UW-Stevens Point.

Coghlin, who completed the Wisconsin Ironman Triathlon in 2006, resides in Weyauwega with his wife, Barb, and son, Joseph.



A.J. Aitken

A.J. Aitken is in his fifth year as the Green Knights' full-time assistant and also heads up the program's junior varsity squad.

Aitken, a Fort McMurray, Alberta, native, played for NCAA Division I Michigan Tech from 1997 to 2000. During his four-year career, Aitken played in 140 games, scoring 14 goals and 17 assists for 31 points. He also served as the Huskies' team captain during his last two seasons. Aitken, a finance major at MTU, was also named Academic All-WCHA twice.

Following his collegiate career, Aitken played with Macon and Memphis of the Central Hockey League. His stint in Memphis, from 2001 to 2003, resulted in being a part of a pair of CHL championships.

Aitken has also been an instructor at the St. Norbert College Hockey School and at the Island Sport Center with Troy Ward and Kevin Constantine.



Tommy Cianflone

Tommy Cianflone is in his first season as a St. Norbert College assistant.

Cianflone, a LaSalle, Quebec, native, played at

St. Norbert from 1998 to 2000. In his three seasons playing for the Green Knights, Cianflone became the first defenseman in school history to score 100 career points. He scored 32 points in 1998-99 and was named a second-team All-American. In 1999-2000, he scored 39 points (9-30-39) to set a school season scoring record for defensemen that still stands and was a first-team All-America selection.

Following his St. Norbert career, Cianflone played for the New Mexico Scorpions of the Western Professional Hockey League.

Cianflone graduated from St. Norbert in 2000, earning his degree in three years.



Chase Emmott

Chase Emmott enters his first season as the St. Norbert hockey program's strength and conditioning coach.

Emmott, a Neenah, Wis., native, was the strength and conditioning coordinator at Michigan Tech from 2003 until the spring of 2007. He was also a defensive line coach for the Huskies' football team from 2002-2004, and was on the staff when Michigan Tech won its first GLIAC football championship in 2004.

A four-year letterwinner on the gridiron for Michigan Tech, Emmott earned all-conference honors in the GLIAC following the 2001 season.

2007-08 St. Norbert College Hockey Preview



Ryan Petersen scored goals in both NCAA Tournament games for St. Norbert last season. Petersen is the 2007-08 team captain.

2003-04, when it lost 1-0 in overtime in the NCAA Division III championship game to Middlebury.

The two seniors – goaltender Kyle Jones and forward Marc Belanger – have both earned All-America honors in past season. Two of the juniors, forwards Ryan Petersen and Steven Sleep, have earned captains' letters on their sweater – with Petersen donning the captain "C."

"We've had success in the past playing a lot of freshmen with seniors in critical spots," said St. Norbert coach Tim Coghlin, who enters his 15th season on the St. Norbert bench with a glossy 295-91-31 record. "It starts with Kyle Jones. When you reflect back on 2004, (goaltender) Chancy Colquhoun had the best six games of his career at the end of the season, and that's why we were where we were."

Jones, who was 25-4-2 last season with a 1.79 goals against average, is the NCAA Division III career leader in goaltender shutouts with 15. His 66 career wins also puts him just seven triumphs shy of breaking the all-time Division III record of 72 set by Plattsburgh State's Rick Strack from 1978-81. Jones, who saw ever minute of action for St. Norbert in 2006-07, owns a 66-9-5 career record.

"Not to put too much on Kyle's shoulders, but it will be different for him without the (defensemen) he's had in front of him the last three years," Coghlin said. "It will all look different this year."

Belanger, a first-team All-America honoree a year ago, led St. Norbert in scoring last season with 21 goals and 20 assists for 41 points, and his nine power-play goals were also a team high.

The next two highest returning scorers from last season were both freshmen in 2006-07 – forwards Matt Boyd and Shane Wheeler. Boyd had 10 goals and 21 assists for 31 points, while Wheeler had eight goals and 20 assists for 28 points. Sleep had 11 goals and 16 assists for 27 points, while Petersen added 13 goals and seven assists for 20 points to balance a deep offensive attack.

"The big thing coming into the year is we don't know what our strength will be," Coghlin said. "This year has been pretty fresh. So far I like what I see. Our ability to play all four lines continues to be a strength. And we look pretty mobile on the blue line."

For most teams, having its youngest team in at least a decade would be problematic. But expectations are still running high for the 2007-08 St. Norbert College hockey season.

With just 13 returning letterwinners from a squad that finished 25-4-2 a year ago, on the surface it would appear the Green Knights might not keep its accustomed perch atop the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association and the NCAA Division III West Region.

Despite its youth, St. Norbert was tabbed No. 2 in the 2007-08 U.S. College Hockey Online Preseason Division III Poll with two seniors, three juniors and 12 freshmen on its roster. The last time St. Norbert had at least 11 freshmen was in

Of the eight defensemen on the roster, four are freshmen, three are sophomores and one, Jon Skoog, is a junior. Skoog played in 29 games last season and is the highest returning scorer on the blue line with nine points a year ago. Jason Nopper played in 28 games last season and scored three points.

"The unique thing this year is that we expect all of our upperclassmen to play virtually every night," Coghlin said. "When you have 10 seniors not all of them play every night. So it makes us a little quiet. We'll be looking for leadership from the underclass."

St. Norbert has won nine NCHA regular-season titles in the last 11 years, clinching a share of the crown last year with UW-Stout and UW-River Falls after trailing the leader by six points with three games left. The Green Knights also won the NCHA Peters Cup six times in the last 10 years and played in its fourth Division III Frozen Four in five years a year ago.

Staying atop the league for such an extended period hasn't been easy, and another challenge awaits this winter. The schedule includes the demanding 14-game NCHA race, six games against the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, a home-and-home series with Milwaukee School of Engineering and an appearance in the Pathfinder Bank Oswego Hockey Classic during Christmas break.

"The big thing with the league is the middle is so much better than it has been the last few years," Coghlin said. "Someone's going to be on the underside, and we have to make sure it's not us."



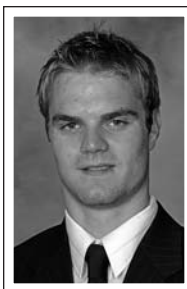

Each year brings a new challenge for the St. Norbert College hockey team in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association.

The Green Knights are aiming for their 10th league championship as they begin their 14th season of league play in the eight-team conference, one of the most prestigious in NCAA Division III hockey.

The league's teams have captured 13 national championships and its regular season champions have advanced to an NCAA Championship game 17 of the past 25 years. The league features teams in the NCAA Division III as well as some of small college hockey's most heated rivalries and intense competition.

The Midwest Conference, to which St. Norbert belongs for all other inter-collegiate competition, does not sponsor hockey, though Lake Forest College, another Midwest Conference member, is a member of the NCHA.

The NCHA begins its 28th season in 2007-2008, with three of the league's six charter members still intact. The league was formed in the early 1980's from a combination of college teams belonging to the now-defunct International College Association and the Western Intercollegiate Hockey Association.

The University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, the University of Wisconsin-River Falls and the University of Wisconsin-Superior all remain from the league's official charter on June 1, 1980. Bemidji State University, Mankato State University and St. Cloud State University were also original members, but have since joined Division I.

Though league play began in 1980-81, it was on an unofficial basis because of an unbalanced schedule. Bemidji State was the first champion crowned in 1981-82.

The College of St. Scholastica raised league membership to seven teams by joining in 1983-84. St. Cloud State left after the 1986-87 season, but the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point entered to keep the league at seven teams. St. Scholastica dropped out after the 1990-91 season and Mankato left after the 1991-92 season. However, Lake Forest joined for the 1992-93 campaign to maintain a six-team conference.

St. Scholastica returned after a three-year hiatus and joined St. Norbert as the league's seventh and eighth members in 1994-95. The University of Wisconsin-Stout became the league's ninth member in 1995-96. Bemidji State left after the 1998-99 season.

The NCHA will continue with league teams playing all other opponents just twice, one home and one away.

The 14-game league schedule increased excitement around the league, and teams battled from start to finish for valuable points in the standings.

The 2007-2008 season is the ninth year of the interlocking schedule with Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The NCHA-MIAC games will showcase the top hockey in the NCAA Division III's West Region.

ABOUT THE CORNERSTONE COMMUNITY CENTER

When 14th century poet Dante Alighieri was penning his masterwork "The Divine Comedy" and the immortal line, "All hope abandon ye who enter here," he could have easily been referring to visiting hockey teams at the Cornerstone Community Center.

The St. Norbert College hockey program enjoys one of the best home advantages in college sports when playing at the Cornerstone. Entering the 2007-08 season, St. Norbert is 79-3-2 in its last 84 games at the Cornerstone, and has a modest 16-game winning streak there. The Green Knights fashioned a 35-game winning streak there from 2002 to 2004.

In the last six seasons, the Green Knights are a sparkling 92-6-4 at the Cornerstone, with three losses and one tie coming to national champion UW-Superior during the 2001-02 season.

All-time, St. Norbert is 101-10-5 at the Cornerstone Community Center, which includes a 9-4-1 mark there its first season in the building in 2000-01. Under Tim Coghlin, St. Norbert is 180-34-11 at home, which includes games at Brown County Arena, Resch Center and De Pere Ice Arena.

The Cornerstone Community Center opened in the fall of 2000 as St. Norbert College's new home rink. The Green Knights played at the De Pere Ice Arena from the program's inception in 1988 until departing for the Cornerstone Community Center.

The main rink features bleacher seating for 1,876 spectators, with standing room pushing the maximum capacity to about 2,000 fans. Fans have outstanding sight lines in the facility, along with radiant heat and ample parking, restroom and concession facilities.

St. Norbert College has its own state-of-the-art locker and training room facilities, and there are 10 auxiliary locker rooms for visiting teams as well as an officials' locker room. An Olympic-sized rink is being added on to the building during the winter of 2007-08.

An auxiliary rink is located to the north of the main rink, which allows the facility to host several youth tournaments as well as other youth play and skatearounds when a St. Norbert College game is in progress.

Also located on the main concourse off the lobby is the St. Norbert College Hockey Shop. The store has the largest inventory of hockey equipment in Northeast Wisconsin as well as St. Norbert College and National Hockey League souvenir merchandise.

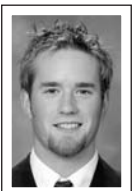

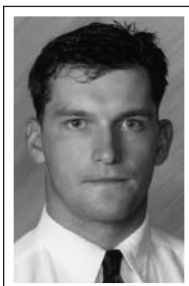

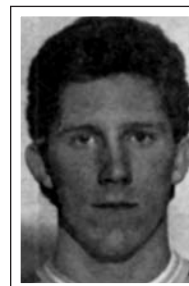

St. Norbert College Hockey History

With a relatively short history as varsity status, hockey at St. Norbert College may not appear to have much of a tradition. But a closer look at the school's history will reveal hockey had its place in the early days of the college itself.

From club teams on the Fox River to packed crowds at the Cornerstone Community Center cheering a national title contender, hockey has always been popular among the students at St. Norbert.

St. Norbert's students formed teams in the 1910s and played competitive intramural games on the Fox River. After several years of informal competition, the school's first club team was formed by the Rev. I.F. Van Dyke and then-men's basketball coach George Carey in the early 1920s. Carey, a former hockey player at Holy Cross College, coached the first team, keeping eight of the 18 students who tried out for the team.

The first team played only two games in 1921 because of a warm winter. The Green Knights defeated the De Pere All-Stars 10-5 in the first game and an American Legion team 6-5 in the second game. All sports were eliminated by the school in 1925 and hockey didn't resume for over 40 years.

In 1968, some dedicated hockey fans started another St. Norbert club hockey team. The team was basically on its own for financial support and held fundraisers to support itself. The team wore old football jerseys from athletics director Mel Nicks during its first season.

Games were played behind Main Hall until 1973 when the team moved inside the Brown County Arena for one season.

The De Pere Ice Arena was completed in December 1974 and the Green Knights became one of the top club teams in the Midwest, compiling a 202-107-11 record from 1973 to 1988 for a .653 winning percentage.

The Green Knights suffered only two losing seasons as a club team in the Central Collegiate Hockey Conference. St. Norbert's best season was in 1976-77 when the Green Knights were 20-2-1, including a 14-game winning streak and a 23-0 win over rival Ripon.

On Oct. 13, 1987, St. Norbert hockey took the next step, earning varsity status at the school. Tom Schlieff, a former player at Augsburg College, was named the first varsity coach as St. Norbert began play in the 1988-89 season.

The Green Knights opened their varsity era with a 6-4 loss to Lake Forest College on Nov. 11, 1988. Todd Pawlicki scored the first St. Norbert goal in front of 438 fans as St. Norbert lost its first four games that season, but went on to finish 8-12.

Schlieff coached three seasons before assistant coach George Wrobel took over the team for two years. The Green Knights struggled through five losing seasons as an independent before former UW-Stevens Point standout Tim Coghlin was named the school's first full-time hockey coach for the 1993-94 campaign.

Coghlin guided St. Norbert to its first winning season that year at 10-9-1. He also helped St. Norbert land conference affiliation in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association, the most prestigious conference in NCAA Division III Hockey.

St. Norbert beat Lake Forest 3-2 in its first NCHA game and went on to win five league games that season before losing to UW-Stevens Point in the league playoffs.

Starting in 1996-97, St. Norbert has been the dominant program in the NCHA, winning five regular-season championships in seven years. The Green Knights also claimed three NCHA Peters Cup titles and have advanced to the NCAA Division III Tournament four times. St. Norbert has posted a 103-37-12 all-time record in NCHA play, the best record in league history with a .717 winning percentage.

In the 2000-01 season, St. Norbert had outgrown the De Pere Ice Arena and moved into the Cornerstone Community Center, a facility twice the size of its old home. The Cornerstone Community Center, with nearly 2,000 seats and a state-of-the-art locker room, is one of the top facilities in Division III hockey.

The 2002-03 season marked another milestone for the Green Knights, with the squad earning its first NCAA Division III Frozen Four appearance in the program history. Their 27-2-2 record was the best in school history.

In 2003-04, the team had its best post-season finish ever, losing to Middlebury College 1-0 in overtime in the national championship game. St. Norbert also finished national runner-up in 2005-06.

School Notes: Bemidji State, MSU-Mankato, UW-River Falls, UW-Superior, St. Cloud State and UW-Eau Claire were charter members for the 1981-82 season.
