Honors students must complete six (6) Honors courses (Class of 2028)

Required Coursework:

- THRS 117 (Honors section)
- PHIL 120 (Honors section)
- HONR 150: Life At SNC
- HONR 301: Life After SNC
- Two Honors courses

Options for Fulfilling Honors Course Requirements:

- ADV-Core Curriculum Courses - Honors Sections
- HONR 450
- Honors Global Seminar(s)
- Study Abroad Experience/Washington Semester/Student Teaching Abroad
- Approved transcriptable faculty-led research

A maximum of one non-Honors study abroad experience may be used to fulfill requirements.

Honors students are NOT required to take an Honors course each semester to fulfill requirements.

Starting in their third semester, student GPAs will be reviewed every semester for probationary status. Students with a GPA of 3.0 or below will be given notice that they are on probation with the Honors Program. During this probationary period, students will not receive priority registration. If, after two semesters, the student's GPA has not recovered (i.e., is still at or below 3.0), the student will be removed from the Honors Program. In addition, Honors students must obtain a cumulative GPA of 3.5 by the end of their senior year to become graduates of the Honors Program.

- Honors Philosophy (PHIL 120) and Honors Theology (THRS 117) should **NOT** be taken in the same semester.
- Finding Honors courses in Knightline: Knightline > Browse Course Timeline > Select Term > Subject: "Honors Program" > Search
OR
- Knightline > Browse Course Timetable > Select Term > Subject: leave field blank > Attribute Type: Select "Honors Section" > Search
