Green Bay, WI – January 29, 2025 – The 30th Annual Community Celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday theme is *A Vision for Peace: Keep the Dream Alive*. Since 1995, students from Brown County have been challenged to paint, draw, or draft a piece of creative writing in celebration of each year's theme. The contest was open to all K-12 students living or attending school in Brown County.

Exhibiting now at the Neville Public Museum are the award-winning works of art, poetry, and writing by 18 Kindergarten through 12th grade students representing 11 area schools.
